Change in Moshi Diocese ordination policy

There is a change in the ordination dates listed on the back of your trading card(s). Seminarians completing their seminary studies will now spend a full year in Pastoral Assignments. These will typically start in July or August. The following year, they will be ordained to the Transitional Diaconate, God willing. After a minimum six month Transitional Diaconate period, they can be ordained to the priesthood.

The Transitional Diaconate ordination will take place in July or August. The ordination to the priesthood will be celebrated in January or February of the following year.

On the back of your seminarian trading cards, you will see the updates such as this:

Tentative diaconate ordination: 2028 Tentative priestly ordination: 2029

With this new policy change, there will be a diaconate ordination in July or August of 2022; however, the next ordination to the priesthood will not take place until January or February of 2023.


